## **Gabriel Bran Lopez – Emerging Leader**



FOUNDING PRESIDENT, YOUTH FUSION

In 2009, Gabriel Bran Lopez founded Youth Fusion, an award-winning charity that works to lower dropout rates, employs over 250 people in Quebec and Ontario, and works on a weekly basis with over 15,000 students, including 4,500 Indigenous youth in Inuit and First Nations communities. The charity specifically focuses on experiential learning; Gabriel launched, among other educational programs, a video gaming creation project with Ubisoft as well as a fashion design project with ALDO Group. Moreover, he also co-founded *FIRST* 

Robotics Quebec and the annual Robotics Festival, two initiatives implemented in collaboration with Bombardier.

In 2015 and 2016, Gabriel was President of the *Jeune Chambre de commerce de Montréal (JCCM)*, the largest youth chamber in the World, and led a successful two-term mandate that contributed to transforming the JCCM into a key player for emerging leaders. Under his leadership, the JCCM created an innovative – and its first - micro-financing fund with *Aéroports de Montreal* to support 375 entrepreneurial ideas.
